Ebenezer Scrooge (A Christmas Carol)

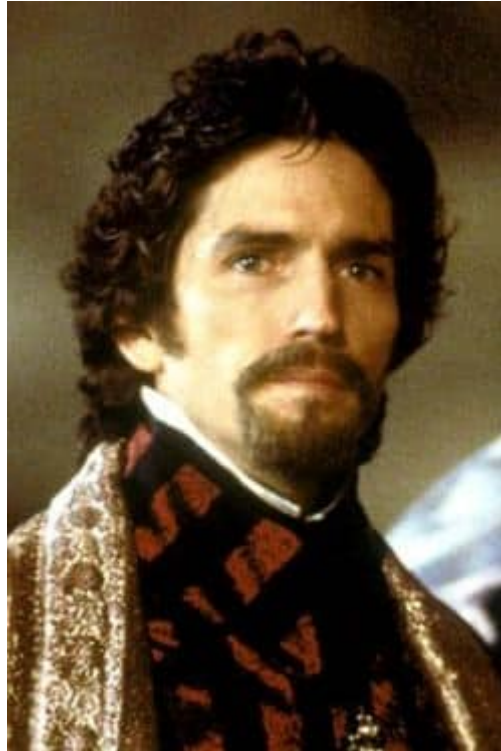

Edmond Dantès (The Count of Monte Cristo)

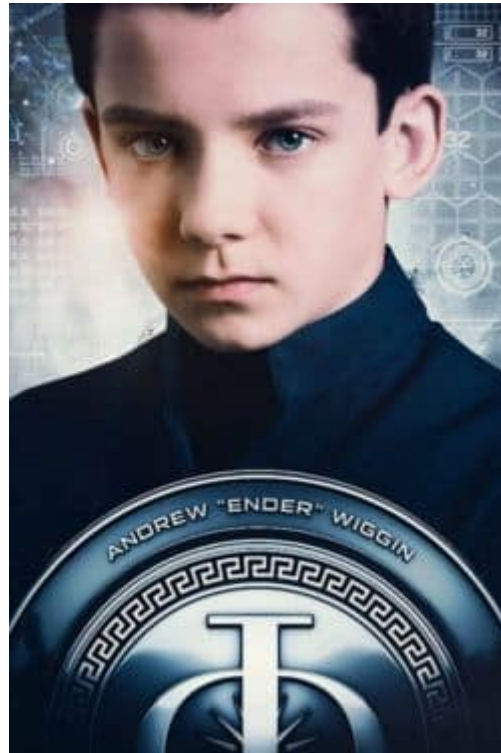
