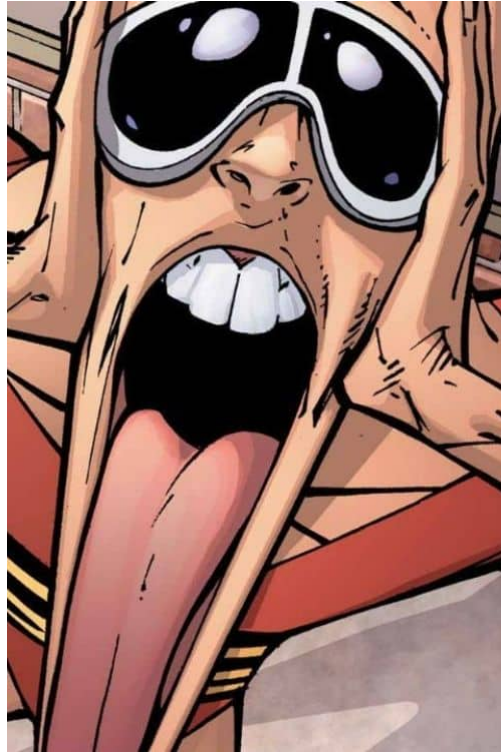
Mister America

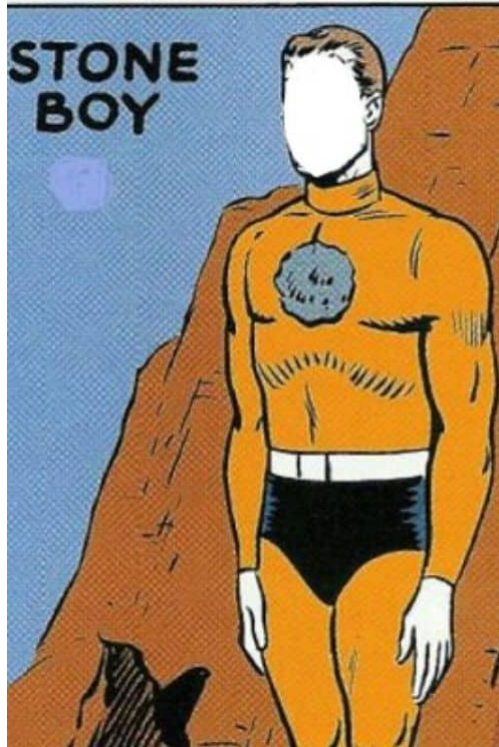
G'Nort

Some readers find G'nort to be annoying because of his lack of serious character development and his limited role in most stories, which frequently is to be used as a source of comedy. 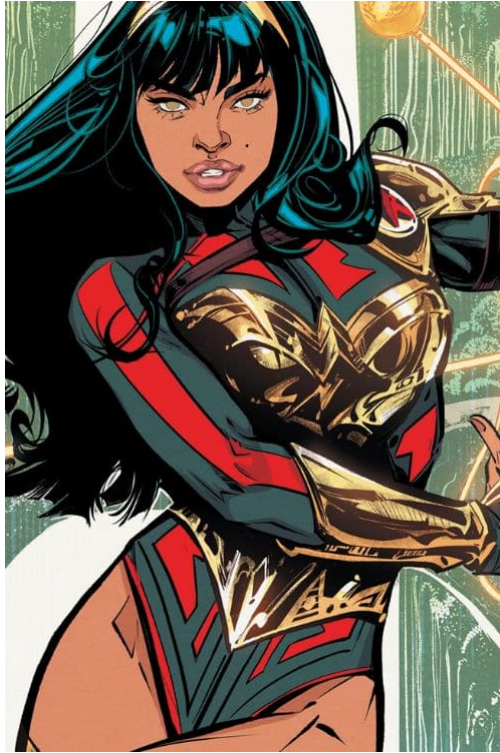
Gunfire
