

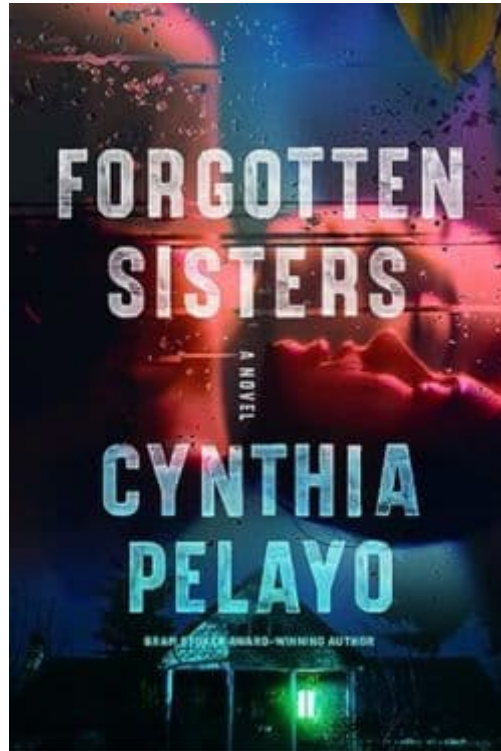

**Forgotten Sisters by Cynthia Pelayo**

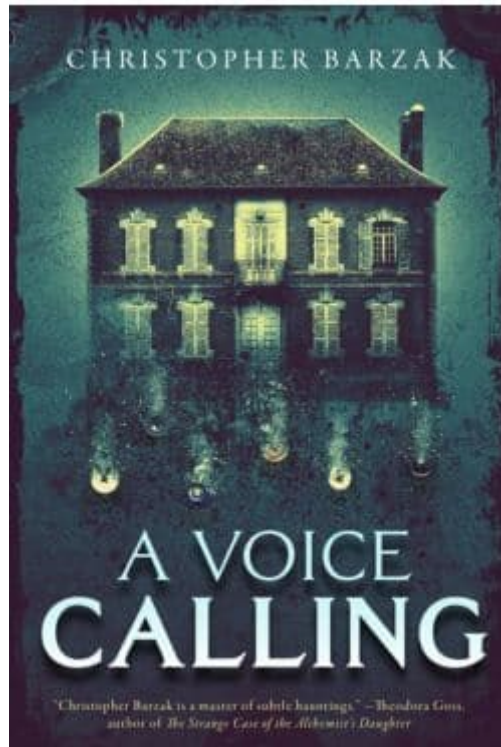


*10 Most Anticipated Horror Books of March 2024 - **Forgotten Sisters** by Cynthia Pelayo*

## A Voice Calling by Christopher Barzak

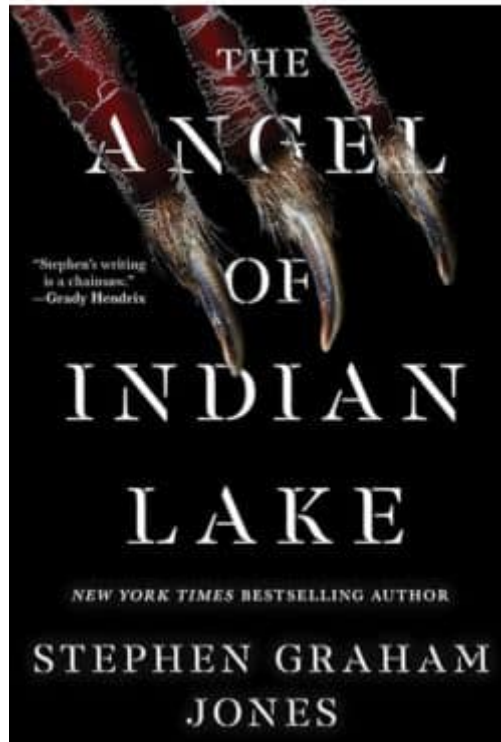


### ***A Voice Calling by Christopher Barzak***

## Through the Night Like a Snake by Sarah Coolidge



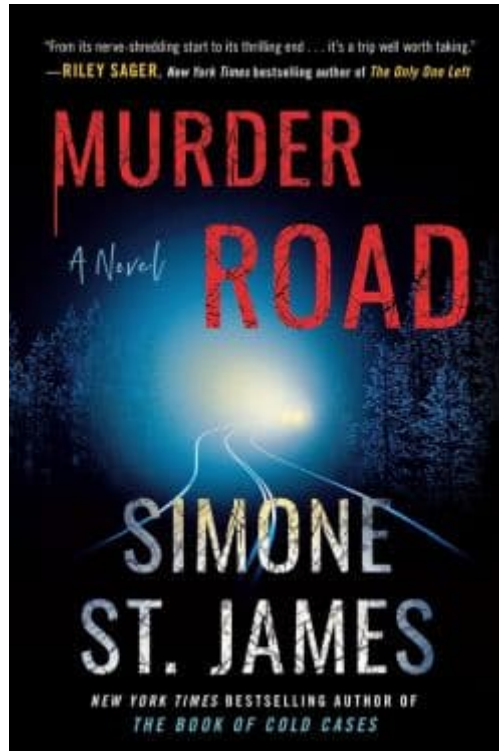

## Murder Road by Simone St. James



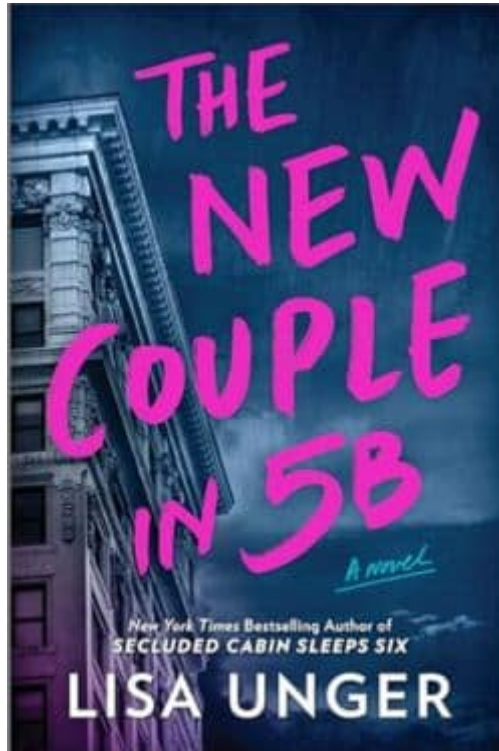
### *Murder Road by Simone St. James*

## The New Couple in 5B by Lisa Unger





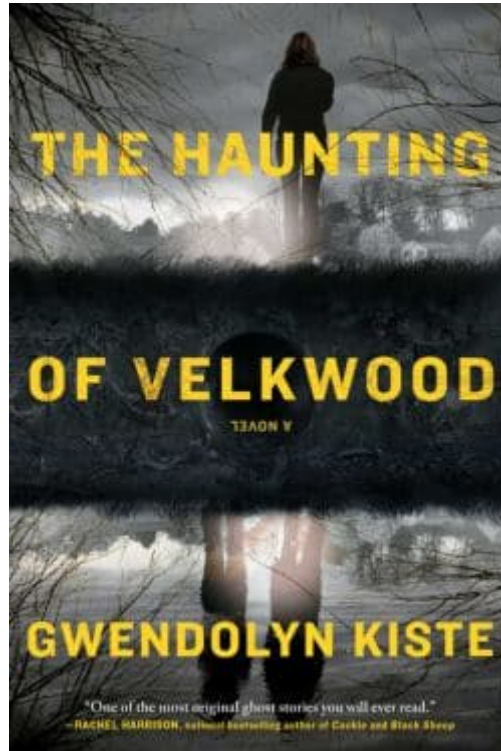

## The Haunting of Velkwood by Gwendolyn Kiste



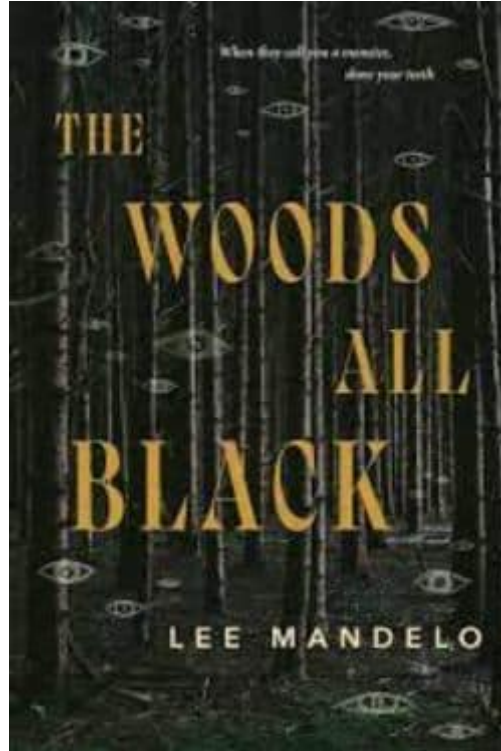


### ***The Haunting of Velkwood by Gwendolyn Kiste***

### **The Woods All Black by Lee Mandelo**

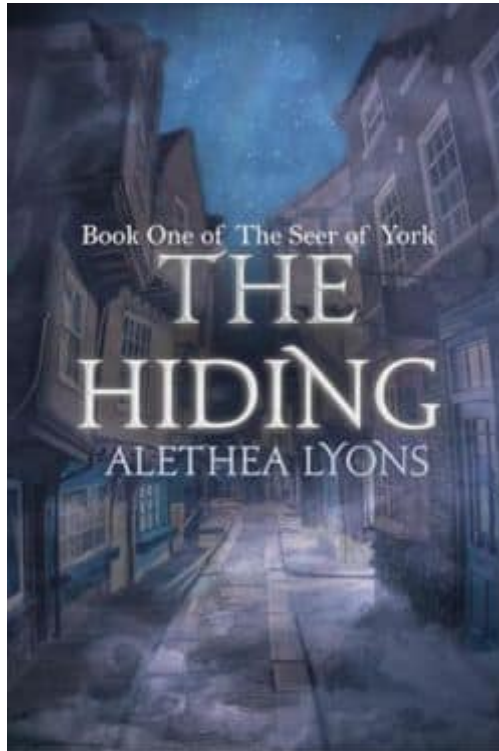
