Harley Quinn

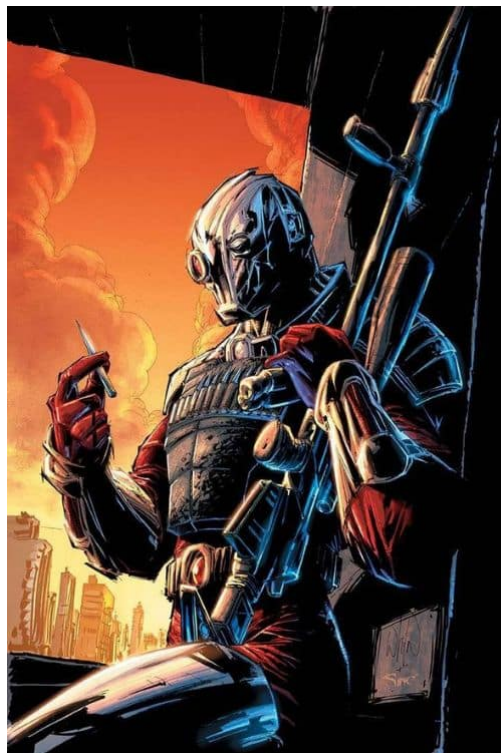

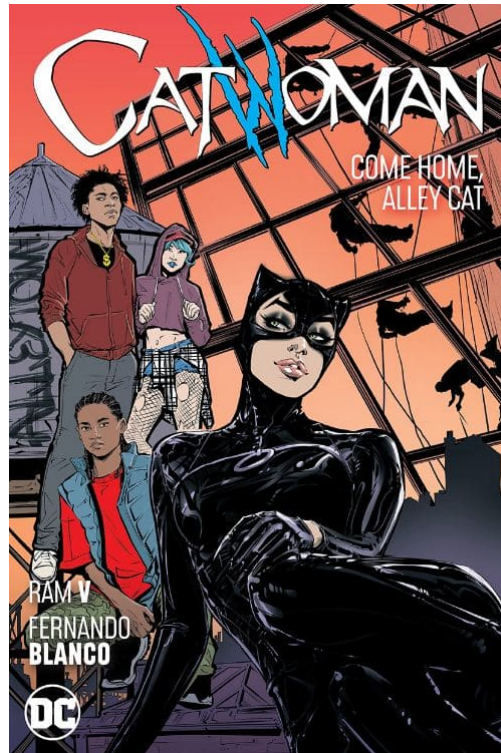
