

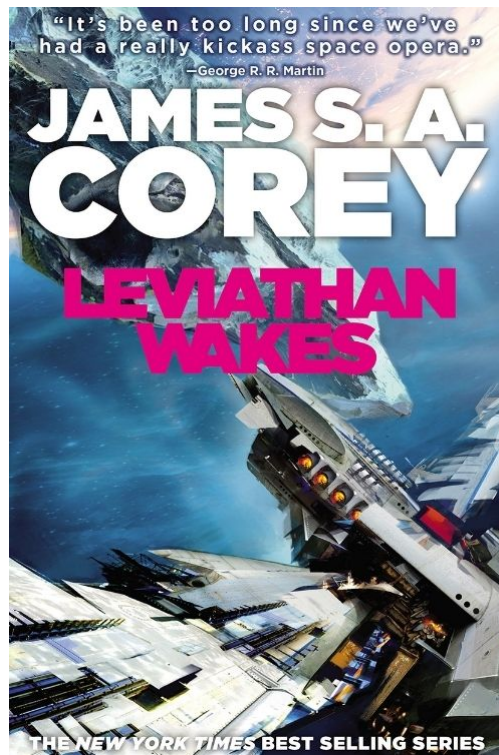

### **Leviathan Wakes by James Corey**

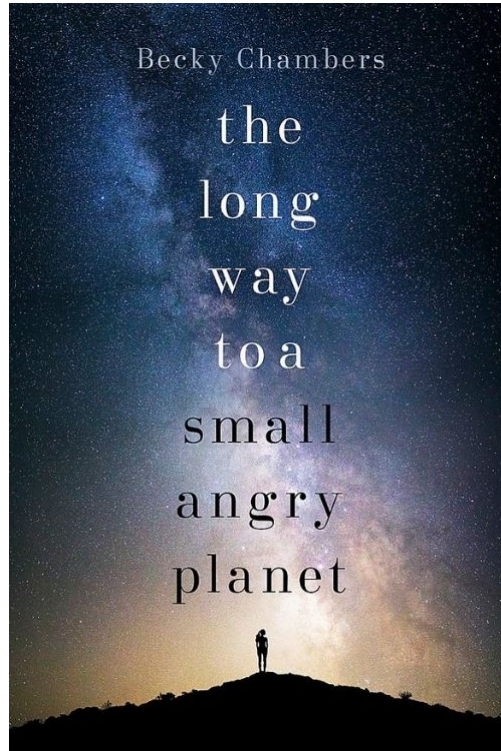

**The Long Way to a Small Angry Planet** by Becky Chambers

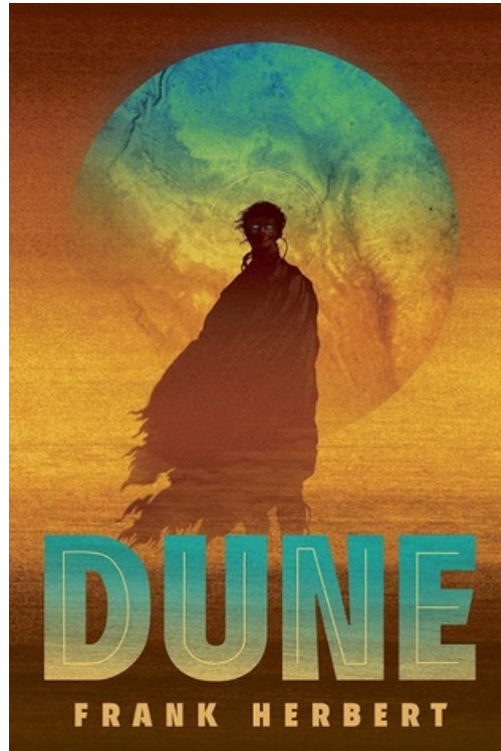

**Dune by Frank Herbert**

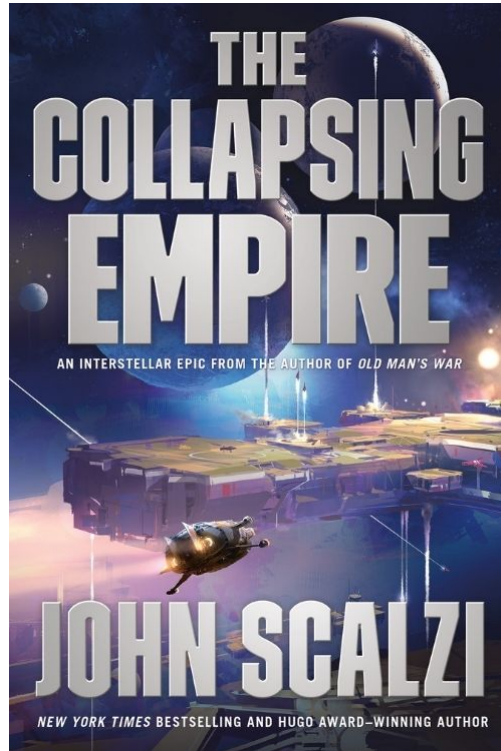

**The Collapsing Empire by John Scalzi**



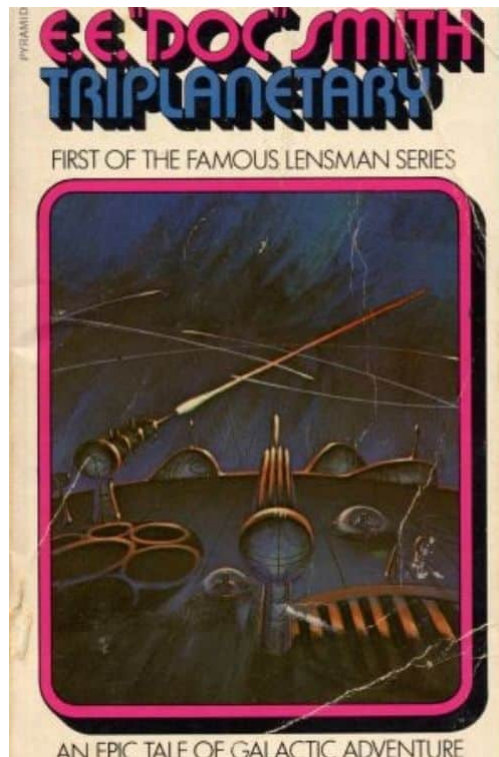

But soon people discover that the flow is not static, but a moving, dynamic force that can isolate people and even the whole of humanity. So now the Empress, a scientist and a starship captain must collude to salvage the empire form collapse.

**Triplanetary by E E Doc Smith**



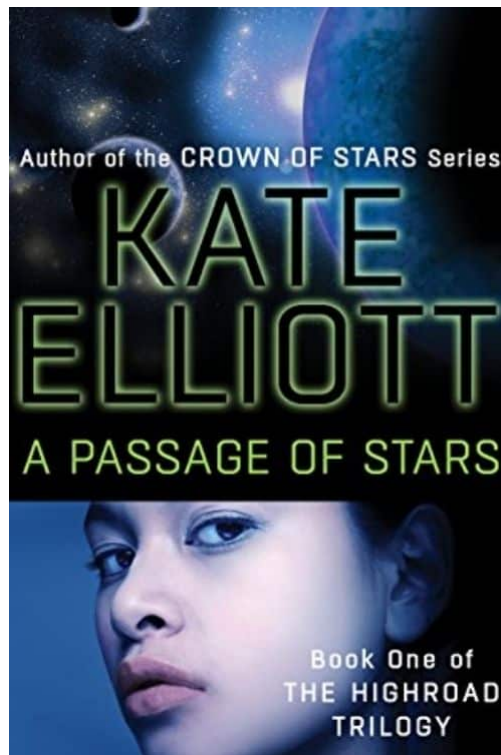

## **Solaris by Stanislaw Lem**



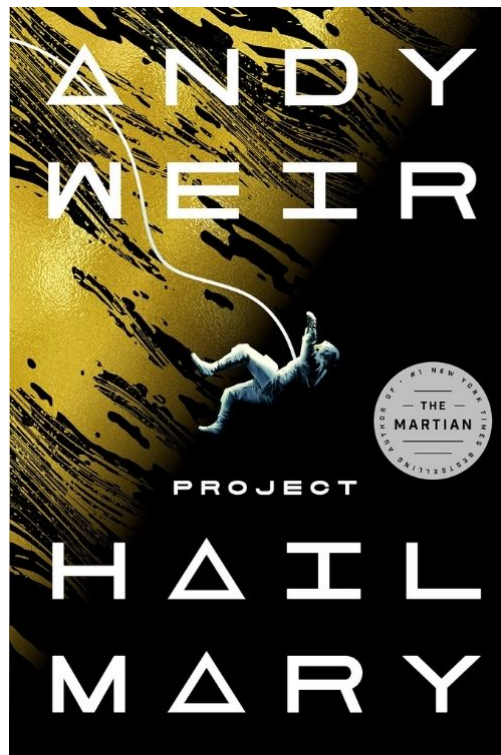

This stunning work of Polish literature follows Krish Kelvin, who arrives on the planet Solaris to study its ocean. However he notices something surreal on the planet. The ocean is an almost living creature, which projects your own repressed memories onto you. In this case, the aliens are not a hoard of human-like figures living on a different planet, the rather the alien is an ocean that no one seems to understand. The novel hinges on the notion that to scale outer depths, you must first scale your inner depths. The discovery of another planet begins with a deep discovery of your own individual being.

As his memories begin to return, he realizes the mammoth nature of the task that he faces and races against time to complete his mission. With fantastic worldbuilding that is replete with sound scientific explanations, this seems less a fantasy and more a mystery. It also has the elements of space travel and intergalactic peoples of Star Wars too.
