subcontinent. Akbar's reign is remembered for its emphasis on cultural integration and religious tolerance.

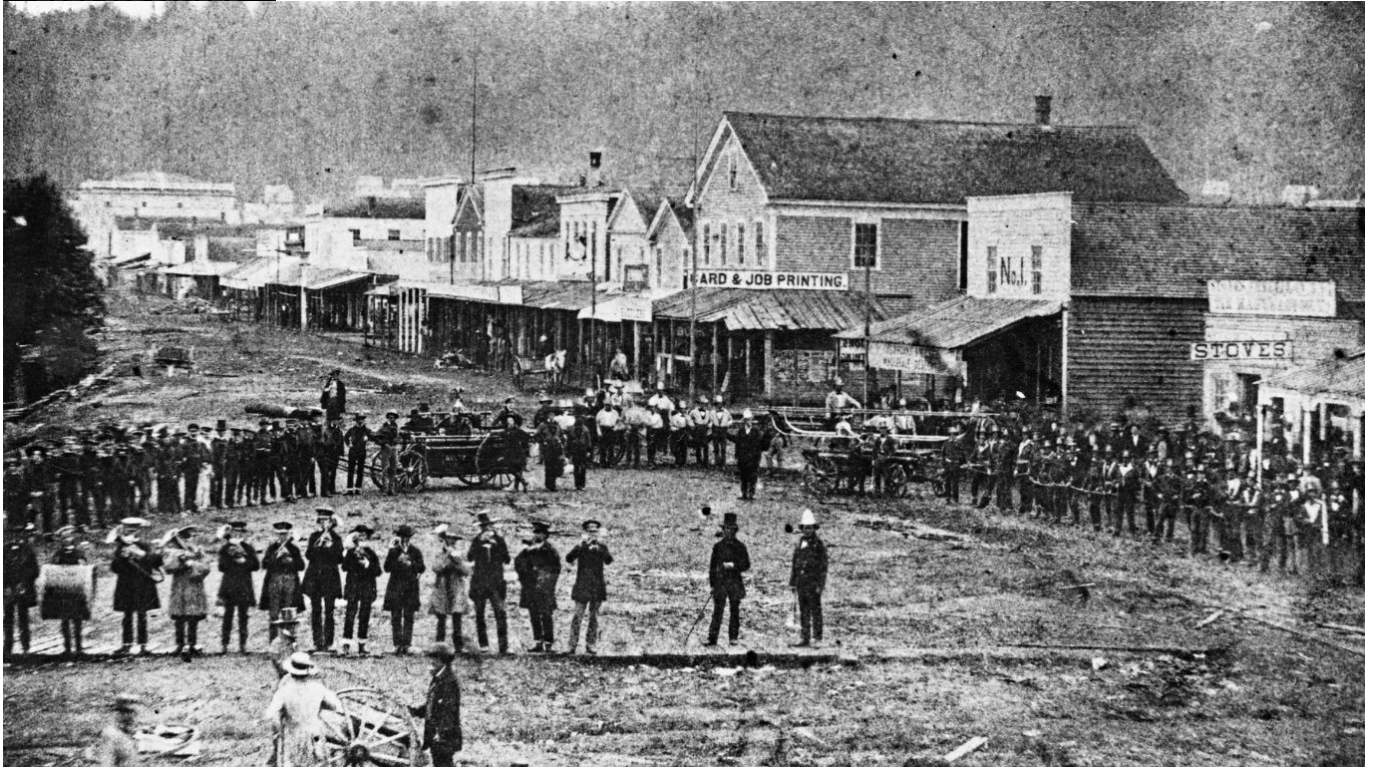
1689: Mary Stuart and William III ascend the English throne
