### ***Major Historical Events on February 24- Today in History - Battle of Pavia (1525)***

In a pivotal clash, Holy Roman Emperor Charles V emerged triumphant over the French army of King Francis I, reshaping the political landscape of Europe and asserting the dominance of the Habsburg Empire.

### **Introduction of the Gregorian Calendar (1582)**

Pope Gregory XIII implemented a new calendar system to rectify inaccuracies in the Julian calendar, aligning dates more accurately with astronomical events and establishing the calendar still used today.

### **Battle of Karnal (1739)**

## Mexican Independence (1821)

Mexico declared independence from Spain after years of struggle, marking the beginning of a new era for the nation and sparking movements for independence across Latin America.

## Publication of the Zimmerman Telegram (1917)

The publication of Germany's secret telegram proposing an alliance with Mexico against the United States in World War I exposed Germany's aggressive tactics and influenced the US decision to enter the war.
