Discovery of Prince Edward Island - 1534 AD

French explorer Jacques Cartier first encountered Prince Edward Island, located off the coast of present-day Canada, in 1534 during his exploration of the Gulf of St. Lawrence.

Globe Theatre Burns Down - 1613 AD

On June 29, 1613, during a performance of Shakespeare's "Henry VIII," the Globe Theatre was destroyed by a fire ignited by a cannon shot used in the play, burning down in under an hour.

Townshend Revenue Act Passed - 1767 AD

The British Parliament enacted the Townshend Revenue Act in 1767, imposing import taxes on tea and other goods in British America, which escalated tensions leading to the American Revolution.

Death of Elizabeth Barrett Browning - 1861 AD

Renowned English poet Elizabeth Barrett Browning, celebrated for her "Sonnets from the Portuguese," passed away at age 55 in 1861 due to complications from a severe chill.

Second Balkan War Begins - 1913 AD

The Second Balkan War erupted in 1913 after Bulgaria attacked Greek and Serbian forces over disputed territories following the Balkan League's victory against the Ottoman Empire.



Birth of Stokely Carmichael - 1941 AD

Civil rights leader and Black nationalist Stokely Carmichael, known for his influential role in the 1960s United States, was born in Port of Spain, Trinidad, in 1941.

Oppenheimer's Security Clearance Revoked - 1954 AD

On June 29, 1954, the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission voted to revoke Dr. Robert Oppenheimer's security clearance. This decision effectively ended the career of the prominent nuclear physicist, who had played a pivotal role in the development of the atomic bomb during World War II.

Baryshnikov's Defection - 1974 AD

Mikhail Baryshnikov, a principal dancer with the Kirov Ballet, defected from the Soviet Union to the United States in 1974 while on tour in Toronto, seeking artistic freedom.



Katharine Hepburn's Passing - 2003 AD

Iconic American actress Katharine Hepburn, known for her strong and eccentric screen presence, died at the age of 96 in 2003, leaving behind a legacy of powerful performances.

Launch of the iPhone - 2007 AD

Apple Inc. revolutionized the mobile phone industry with the launch of the first iPhone on June 29, 2007, introducing a touchscreen interface and app-based functionality.

Bernie Madoff's Sentencing - 2009 AD
