


Novel set in Russia by acclaimed author Elizabeth Gilbert pulled from publication | 1

Gilbert acknowledged the emotions expressed by her Ukrainian readers, which included anger, sorrow, disappointment, and pain over the book's proposed release due to its Russian backdrop. She emphasized, "I have listened to these messages, read them, and I deeply respect them."

Gilbert explained that her decision was driven by the ongoing war between Russia and Ukraine, which has lasted for over a year, resulting in the displacement of millions of Ukrainians and leading to business ties being severed with Russia by major corporations. She stated, "I do not wish to contribute any further harm to a group of people who have already suffered and continue to endure tremendous harm."

Elizabeth Gilbert, a highly successful author and journalist, gained widespread acclaim for her bestselling novel, "Eat, Pray, Love: One Woman's Search for Everything Across Italy, India, and Indonesia," which has sold over 10 million copies globally. The book's popularity led to its adaptation into a feature film featuring renowned actors Julia Roberts and Javier
