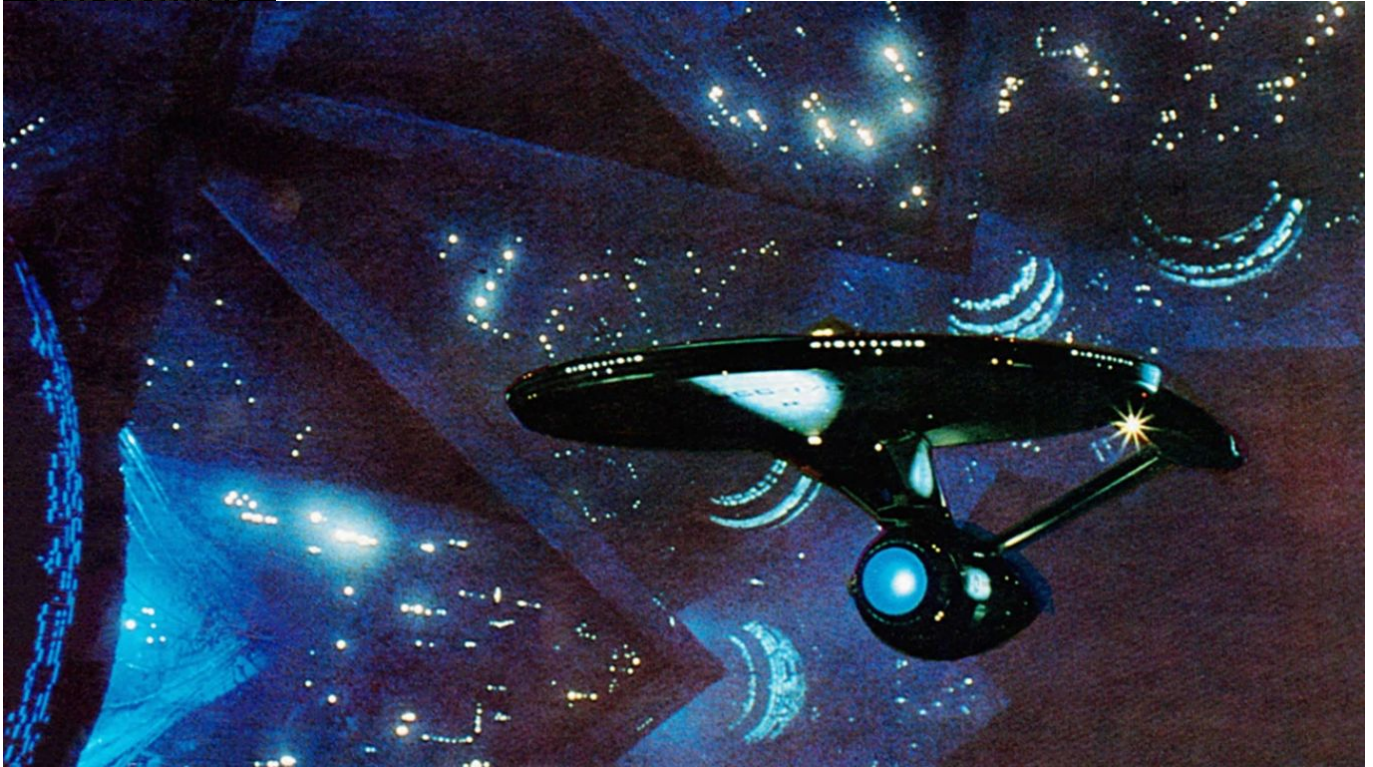
Planet of the Apes (1968-present)
