

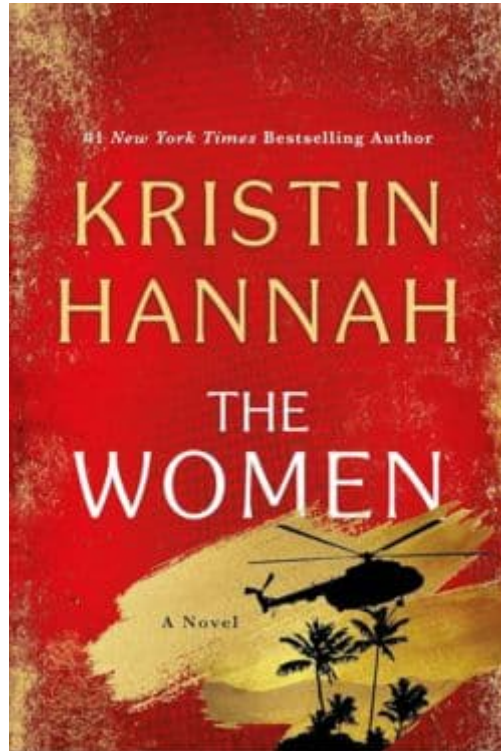

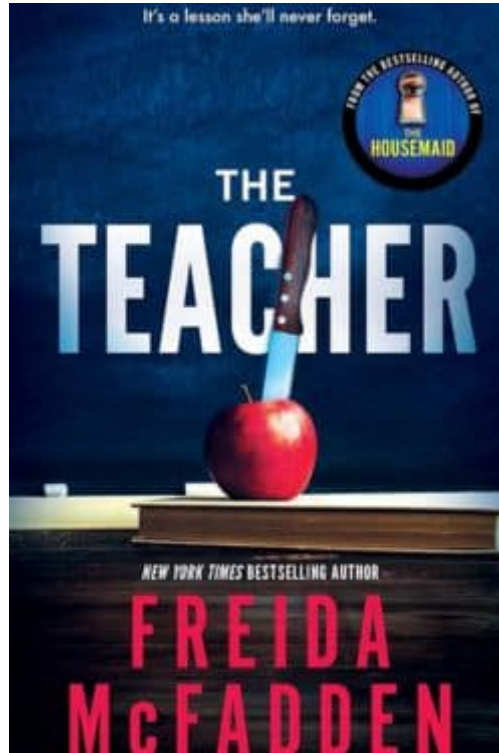


The Women (Kristin Hannah)

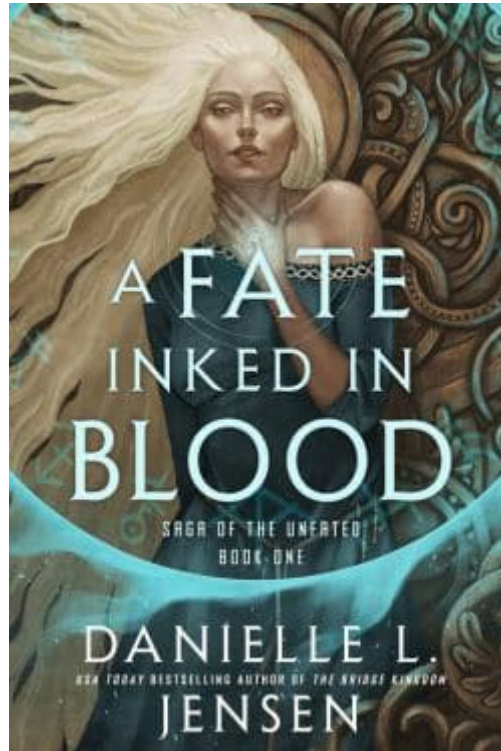

A Fate Inked in Blood (Danielle L. Jensen)

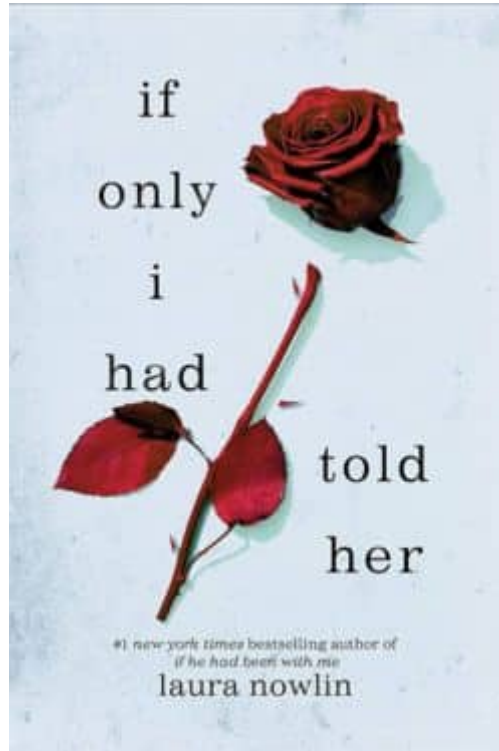

The Phoenix Crown (Kate Quinn)

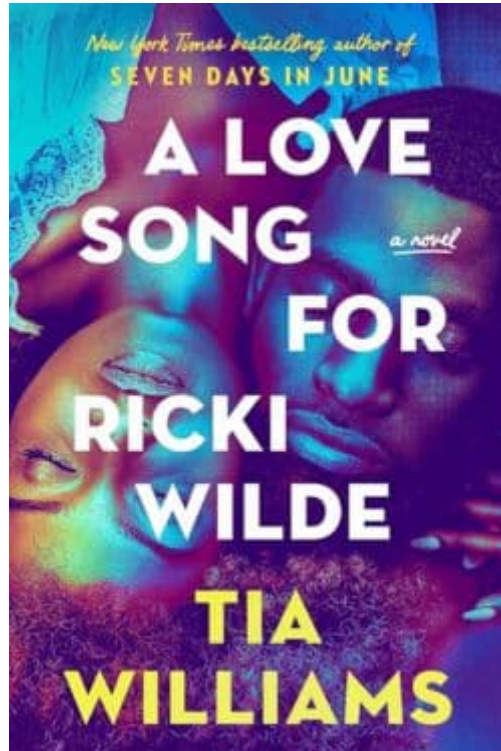

A Love Song for Ricki Wilde (Tia Williams)



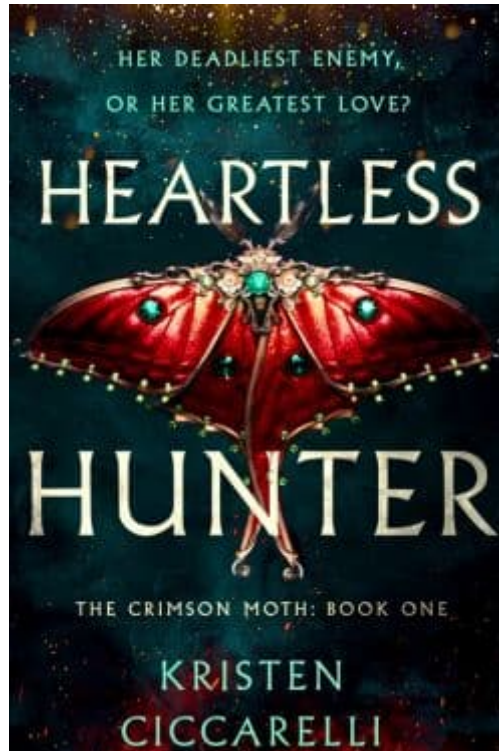

Heartless Hunter (Kristen Ciccarelli)



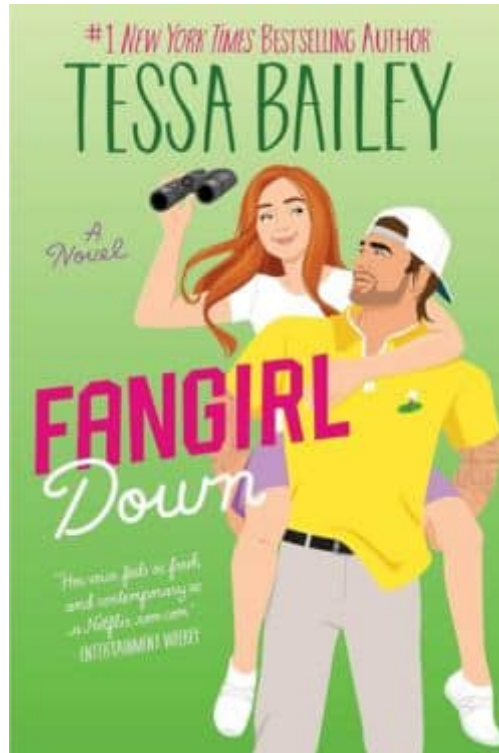

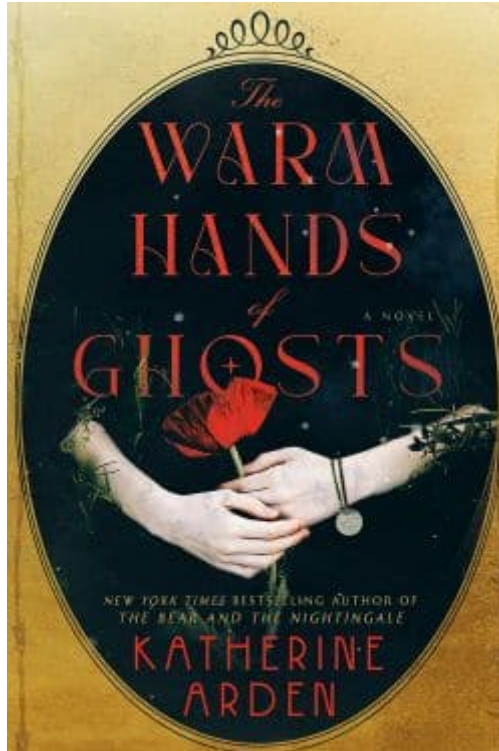
