



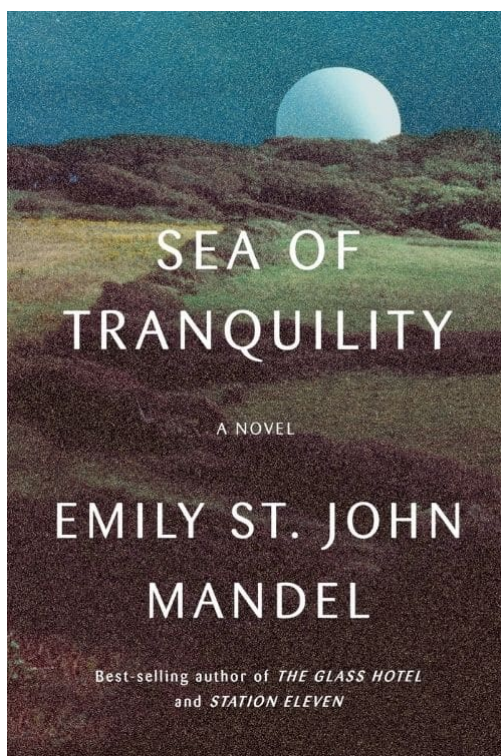

Sea of Tranquility - Emily St. John Mandel

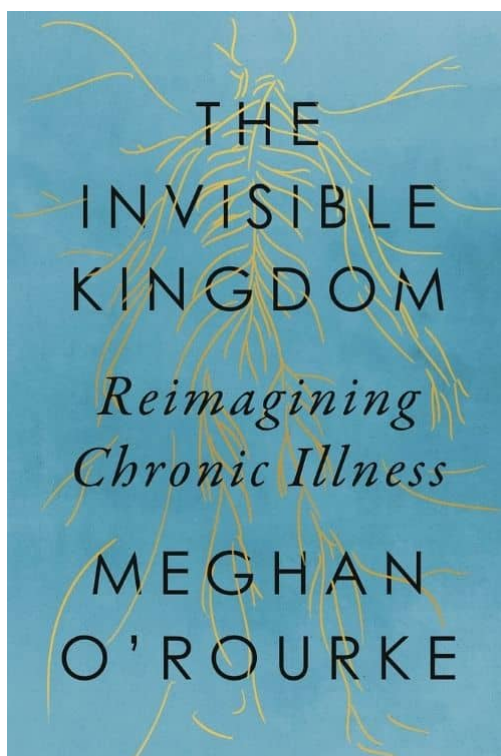

The Invisible Kingdom - Meghan O'Rourke

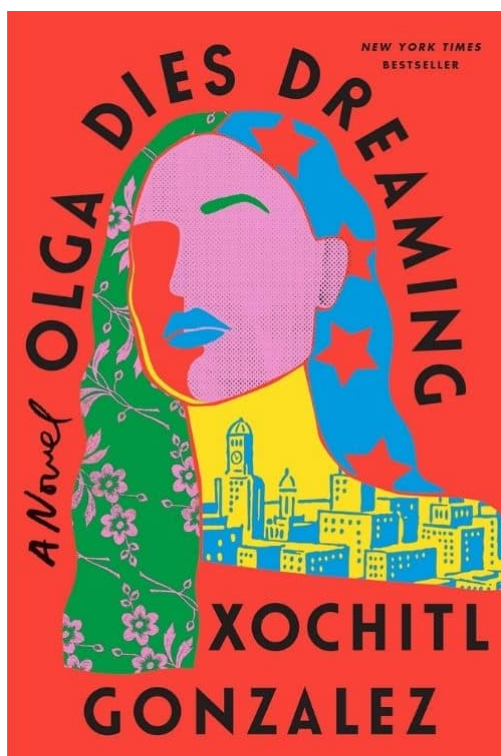


The Invisible Kingdom - Meghan O'Rourke

Olga Dies Dreaming - Xochitl Gonzalez

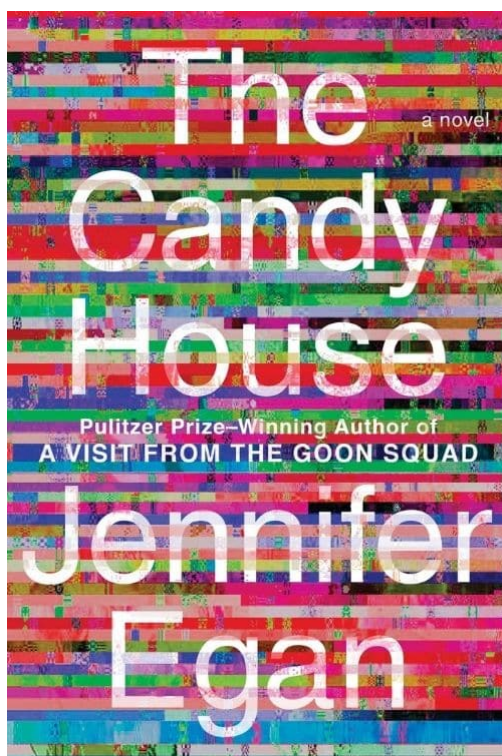

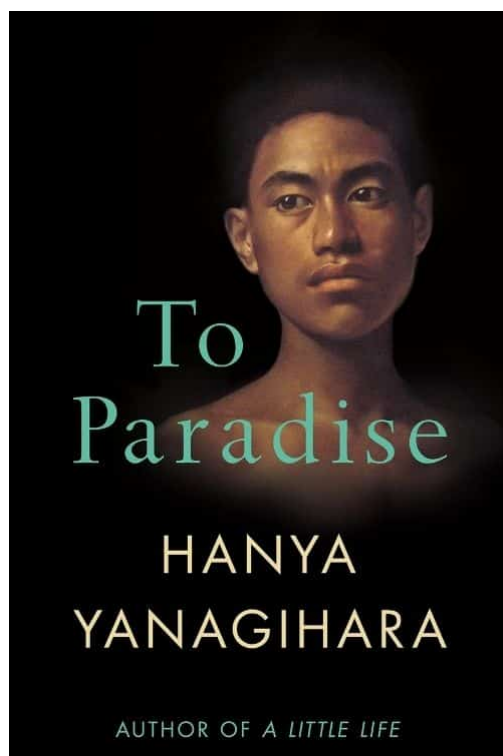

To Paradise - Hanya Yanagihara

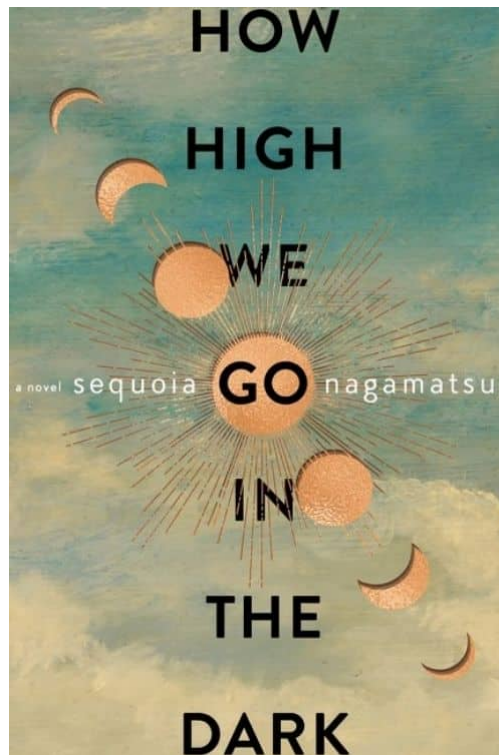


To Paradise - Hanya Yanagihara

How High We Go In the Dark - Sequoia Nagamatsu

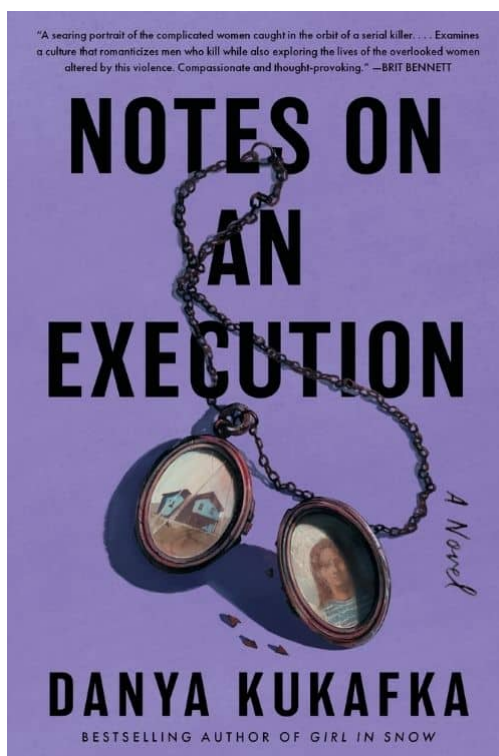

Notes On An Execution - Danya Kukafka

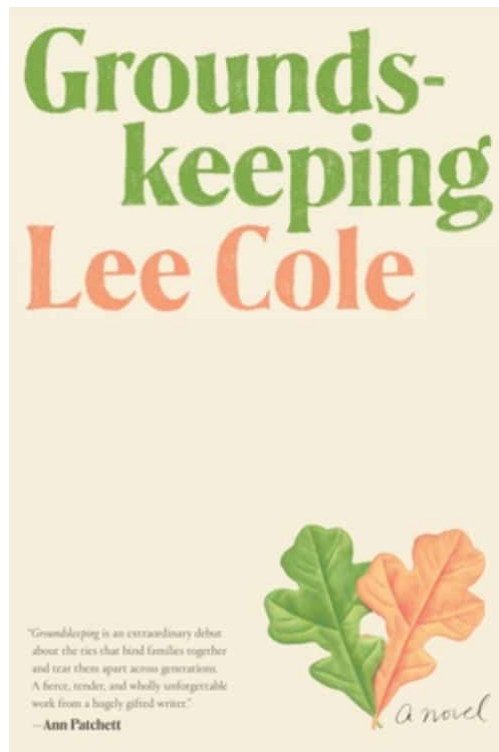

Groundskeeping - Lee Cole

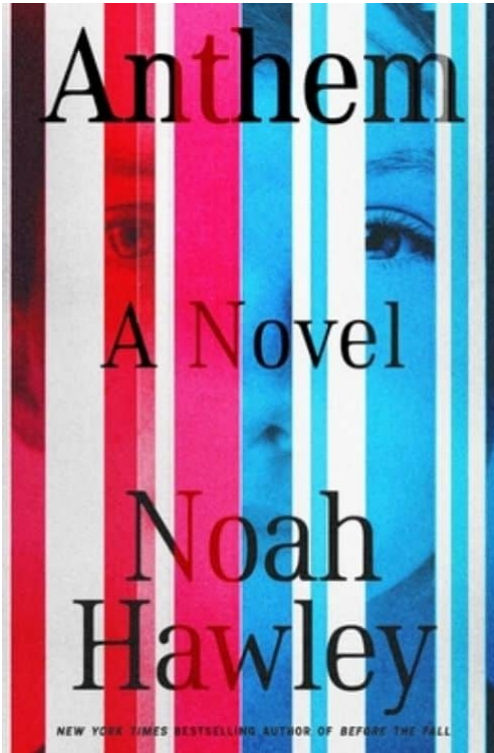
