

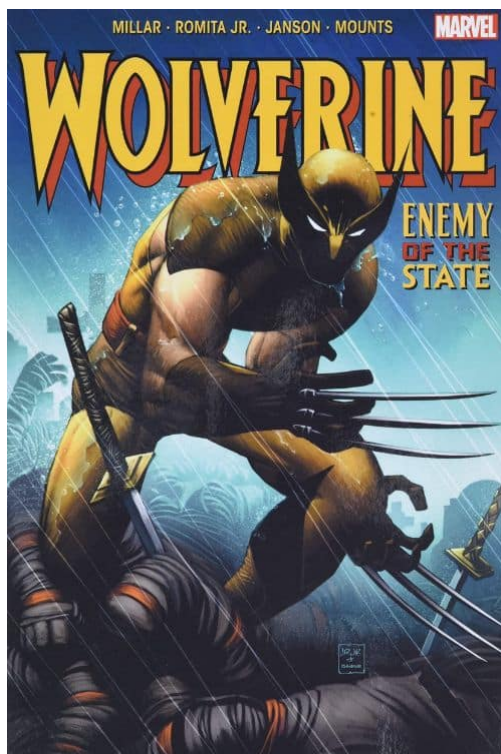

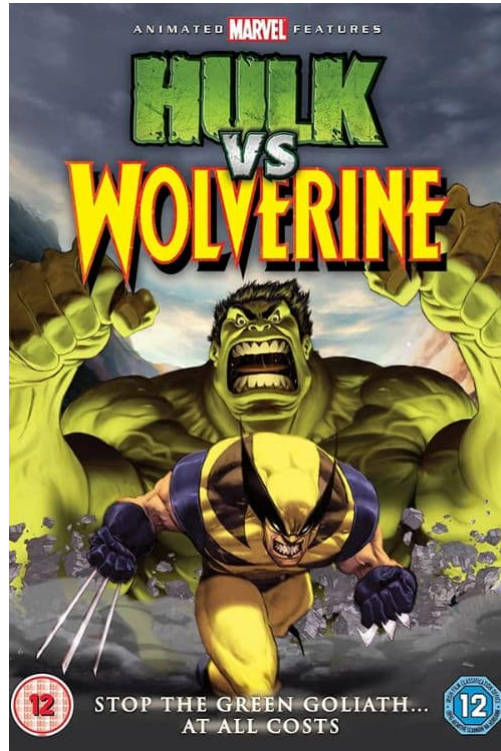
Wolverine: Enemy Of The State

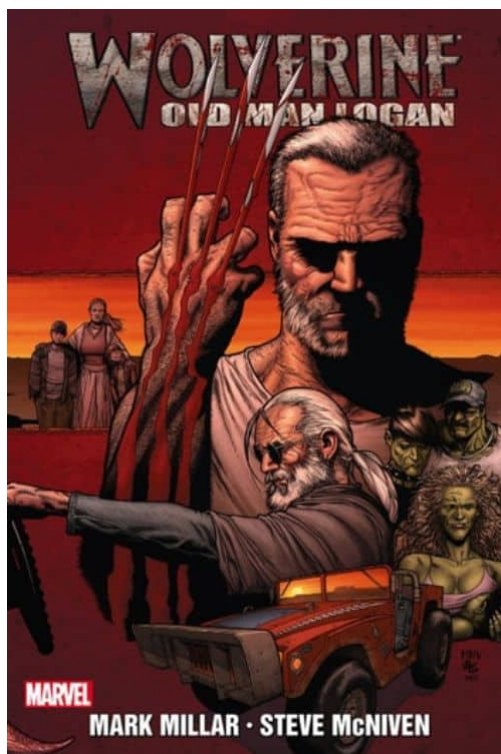
X-Men: The Animated Series
