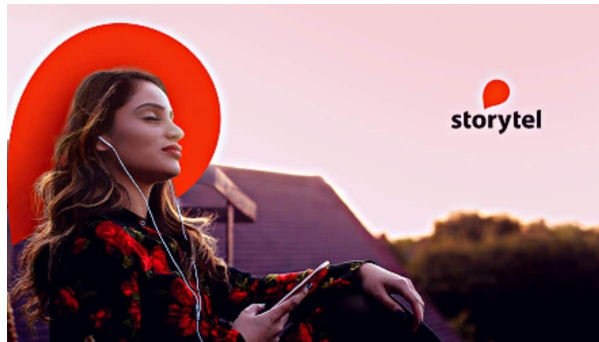
Top 5 Websites For Audiobooks

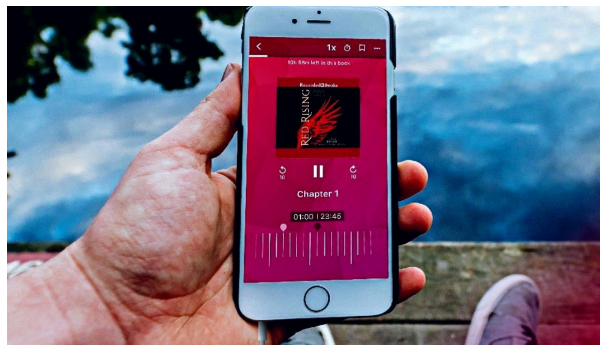
Top 5 Websites For Audiobooks
